From NAFI's Chair

The State of Flight Training

Given the sudden dislocation that occurred last year due to the worldwide pandemic, many of us have been concerned about the status of the flight training industry. The information we see has largely been anecdotal in nature, often based on informal questions to the training community. Because of the unscientific nature of the questions and as well as the confirmation bias that inevitably become baked into non-scientific surveys, we are not very certain of the results.

You recently received an email from NAFI with a link to a survey published by Redbird Flight Training that is designed to provide solid data in answering these questions and to set a baseline. This survey, *State of Flight Training: 2021 Survey and Report*, was created in partnership with several organizations, including NAFI. As stated on the survey's cover page, "To move forward, we first must look back on an unprecedented year in flight training. Participate in Redbird's research to help the flight training community identify and analyze industry trends, priorities, strengths, and challenges as we strategize for the year ahead."



Your participation in the survey will help the industry answer key questions and formulate plans for the future. Your participation is critical in knowing where we stand as an industry. Without real data, it is difficult for all of us to assess our current and near-term plans. Should a school invest in more and/or newer aircraft? What about inventories of training material, a concern for both manufacturers and suppliers? Is training activity up, as many have heard, or is there a slump in business, something else that we've all heard? In the longer term, what trends are evident in the training pipeline? In short, what is really happening in our industry? You will help provide those answers.

Aero Friedrichshafen Postponed Until Mid-July

Citing COVID-19, Aero announced that it has rescheduled the expo from April 21 to July 14 to 17. In a brief statement, Messe Friedrichshafen's CEO Klaus Wellmann said, "Following the cancellation of the event last year, the uncertainties surrounding the pandemic coupled with the renewed lockdown extension unfortunately mean that AERO Friedrichshafen will have to be postponed." Aero was one of the early casualties of a wave of event cancellations last year as the COVID-19 epidemic gained traction in Europe and throughout the world. While other shows in the United States and elsewhere have also been postponed or canceled, Sun 'n Fun announced this week that the Lakeland, Florida show is still scheduled for April 13 to 18, 2021. VFS Cancels In-Person Forum 77

Add the Vertical Flight Society (VFS) to the list of aviation organizations cancelling in-person events in 2021 due to the global pandemic. On Friday, AIN reported that VFS scrapped its annual in-person Forum 77 gathering, which was slated for Palm Beach, Florida, from May 10 to 14. That event will now go virtual. The extent of the reluctance of VFS members to gather in-person was shown in a recent survey conducted by the organization: 75 percent said they would not attend; 65 percent said their organizations precluded travel to Palm Beach; only 8 percent said they are confident that they would be vaccinated by May 11; and 51 percent said they were not confident. Also last week the Helicopter Association International (HAI) pulled the plug on its in-person annual Heli-Expo convention, which had been scheduled for March 22 to 25 in New Orleans.

Planned Supersonic AS2 Takes Leap Forward With New Florida HQ

U.S. planemaker Aerion, whose AS2 jet promises to fly New York to London in 4.5 hours, is building a massive new global headquarters in Florida ahead of production beginning on the supersonic craft in 2023. It's a big step forward for the company, which will use some of the \$300 million it has attracted in capital investment to develop the 110+ acre Aerion Park in Melbourne, right next to Orlando Melbourne International Airport. The new HQ and integrated campus for research, design, production and interior completions of the supersonic craft promises to bring 675 new high-paying jobs to the area by 2026. Frontier Airlines and ATP Flight School have formed a "Frontier Direct Program" targeting ATP graduates and CFIs for employment as Frontier Airlines First Officers. In the Frontier Direct Program, ATP graduates and instructors progress from ATP straight to the flight deck at Frontier after enhanced ATP CTP training that includes additional Airbus A320 full-motion flight simulator experience. FAA Names Susan Northrup Federal Air Surgeon

The FAA appointed Dr. Susan Northrup as the federal air surgeon, responsible for all medical programs with the agency. Northrup succeeds Michael Berry, who held the role since January 2017. Northrup, the first female to be selected for the position, oversees airman medical certification, air traffic control specialist medical qualification policy, medical decision-making policy, aeromedical education programs, medical appeals, medical and human factors research, drug and alcohol testing programs, and aircraft accident investigations involving medical factors.

A private pilot and retired U.S. Air Force colonel who served during Desert Storm and Desert Shield, she previously has served as the FAA's acting deputy federal air surgeon and senior regional flight surgeon. Northrup also has held leadership roles as vice-chair for aerospace medicine on the American Board of Preventive Medicine, U.S. head of delegation to NATO's aeromedical working group, and past president of the American Society of Aerospace Medicine Specialists and the Civil Aviation Medical Association. More recently, she has been the FAA medical subject matter expert to ICAO's Covid-19 response. Read more [here](#).

Terrafugia Announces FAA Special Light-Sport Airworthiness Certificate

Terrafugia announced that it has reached a significant milestone by obtaining an FAA Special Light-Sport Aircraft (LSA) airworthiness certificate for its Transition roadable aircraft. As an integration of a two-seat aircraft and an automobile, the Transition is designed to meet safety standards from both the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the National Highway and Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). The vehicle that received the certificate is legal for flight and represents the initial version of the Transition roadable aircraft. Terrafugia will produce and sell additional initial (flight-only) versions to interested parties and will evolve the driving portion of the Transition design, with the goal of being legal both in the sky and on local roads in 2022.
